Presenting a program of jazz, classical, show tunes, Jewish songs and original compositions, keyboardist Richard Shulman weaves a musical tapestry designed to entertain and enlighten. A spontaneous "Musical Soul Portrait" created specifically for the audience is a specialty in every Shulman concert.

Shulman received his Bachelor's degree in music (piano performance) from the University of Rochester, attended the prestigious Eastman School of Music, studied jazz improvisation with Chuck Mangione and Marian McPartland, and got his Masters Degree in musical composition at the State University of New York at Buffalo.

He has recorded 18 albums, first as a jazz musician in New York, and becoming known in the past decade in the worlds of new age music and contemporary classical composition and performance. His recent album, Camelot Reawakened, is a contemporary-classical, nine-movement symphony featuring Shulman on acoustic piano with members of the Asheville Symphony Orchestra, a choir, and vocal and instrumental soloists. Camelot Reawakened won the 2003 Coalition of Visionary Resources award for "Best Other Music."



Shulman has performed at Carnegie Hall, Art Park, the United Nations, the Kool Jazz Festival, The Amenia Peace Festival and a wide variety of other venues throughout North America and Europe. He also has composed music for and performed on more than a dozen albums by singers and speakers in the field of guided meditations and visualizations.
